Today we journey west past the Corrieshalloch Gorge to , we continue by single track roads across Sutherland past Oykel Bridge and the famous Shinn Falls back to Beaulay.

Thursday

A scenic journey as we cross the Grampian Mountains past the Ski Centre at the Lecht, we continue through Royal Deeside to the Granite city of Aberdeen, the last part of our journey today sees us following the coast and crossing the Tay Bridge to arrive at Anstruther .

Friday

A free day in the attractive old fishing port of Anstruther, maybe visit the Fisheries Museum, take a boat trip to the Isle of May, Kellie Castle or the fascinating Scotland's Secret Bunker.

Saturday

We cross the Forth Bridge and drive past the Pentland Hills and the source of the river Tweed to Moffat, before returning to Shropshire by the early evening.
